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1. Summary of Consolidated Operating Results, etc.

(1) Summary of FY2/25 Consolidated Operating Results

In connection with a change in the fiscal year-end, the fiscal year ended February 28, 2025 (the "fiscal year under review") is an irregular fiscal year (May 16, 2024–February 28, 2025) covering 9.5 months only. Therefore, we do not present year-on-year percentage changes, but instead provide actual figures for the 12 months of the previous fiscal year (May 16, 2023–May 15, 2024) as reference information.

During the fiscal year under review, the economy was on a gradual recovery trend, with recovery in capital investment and production, and improvement in corporate performance. Real wage growth has been up and down due to higher prices, with an increase in saving ratio, and consumer spending has been sluggish. Uncertainty about the future continued due to trade disputes related to U.S. protectionist policies and geopolitical risks including the situation of the Middle East.

In the drugstore sector, prices of mainly foods still continued to rise, and consumers also continued to be money-conscious, amid indications that the increase in sales due to the effects of the recovery in human flow and demand for inbound tourism, rising prices, and other factors have run their course. With a race to open new stores continuing, some stores incorporated other types of businesses such as pharmacy chain stores and grocery stores, and the market size continued to increase.

Under these circumstances, the Group has made progress in the following areas during the current fiscal year, which marked the final year of our Medium-Term Management Plan, in order to achieve the plan's objectives. In our store strategy, we have promoted store openings through the use of company-owned buildings and scrap-and-build initiatives. In our dispensing strategy, we have strengthened the functionality of our pharmacies. In our private brand (PB) strategy, we worked on product development with a focus on food products and improvement of store loyalty. In our DX strategy, we worked to expand our app membership and leveraged MA tools to drive customer visits while enhancing management visibility through BI tools. In the performance management aspect, we focused on improving profitability and reducing selling, general and administrative expenses.

In terms of store development, we have worked to establish even more dominant positions in existing areas and renovated or eliminated unprofitable stores to boost competitiveness. Since the start of the fiscal year under review, we have carried out 73 new store openings and closed 68 stores. This resulted in a total of 2,658 directly managed stores as of the end of the fiscal year under review. In Thailand, the Group opened three new stores, resulting in a total of 22 stores as of February 28, 2025.

amount and the carrying amount as a result of assessing the profitability of our stores, and a provision for loss on store closings of \$3,110 million for anticipated future losses as a result of store closures. Consequently, net income attributable to owners of the parent amounted to \$17,207 million (\$21,743 million for the previous fiscal year).

(2) Summary of FY2/25 Consolidated Financial Position

As of the end of the fiscal year under review, assets totaled \(\frac{4}{5}83,362\) million, an increase of \(\frac{4}{3}3,810\) million compared with the previous fiscal year-end. Current assets totaled \(\frac{4}{3}302,811\) million, an increase of \(\frac{4}{2}29,329\) million compared with the previous fiscal year-end. This was mainly due to an increase of \(\frac{4}{3}34,051\) million in cash and deposits.

Non-current assets totaled ¥280,550 million, an increase of ¥4,481 million compared with the previous fiscal year-end. This was mainly due to an increase of ¥6,320 million in property, plant and equipment, mainly as a result of new store openings, which was partly offset by decreases of ¥1,041 million in intangible assets, primarily reflecting amortization of goodwill and software; and ¥2,239 million in investment securities due to sale.

Net assets totaled \(\frac{4}{3}06,377\) million, an increase of \(\frac{4}{1},080\) million compared with the previous fiscal year-end. This was mainly due to an increase of \(\frac{4}{3},171\) million in retained earnings, which was partly offset by a decrease of \(\frac{4}{1},647\) million in valuation difference on available-for-sale securities.

As a result, the equity ratio was 48.2%, down 2.7 percentage points from the previous fiscal year-end.

(3) Summary of FY2/25 Consolidated Statement of Cash Flows

As of the end of the fiscal year under review, cash and cash equivalents (net cash) totaled ¥92,605 million, an increase of ¥34,051 million from the end of the previous fiscal year.

The Group's cash flow position and their factors at the end of the fiscal year under review are as follows:

(Cash Flows from Operating Activities)

Net cash provided by operating activities totaled \$64,643 million (\$51,964 million provided for the previous fiscal year). This mainly reflected income before income taxes of \$28,381 million, and other positive factors were an increase of \$25,254 million in notes and accounts payable – trade, depreciation of \$13,207 million, and impairment loss of \$10,743 million. The main negative factor was income taxes paid of \$15,300 million.

(Cash Flows from Investing Activities)

Net cash used in investing activities totaled \(\pm\)19,713 million (\(\pm\)36,068 million used for the previous fiscal year). This was mainly due to purchase of property, plant and equipment of \(\pm\)20,110 million for new store openings, payments for guarantee deposits of \(\pm\)4,073 million for new store openings, and purchase of software of \(\pm\)2,732 million.

(Cash Flows from Financing Activities)

Net cash used in financing activities totaled \(\pm\)10,872 million (\(\pm\)36,259 million used for the previous fiscal year). This was mainly due to cash dividends paid of \(\pm\)14,035 million, repayment of long-term loans payable of \(\pm\)5,400 million, and repayment of short-term loans payable of \(\pm\)5,000 million, which were partly offset by proceeds from short-term borrowings of \(\pm\)10,000 million and proceeds from long-term borrowings of \(\pm\)6,000 million.

(4) Business Forecasts

Looking ahead, the global economy is expected to grow steadily, supported by the strong domestic demand in the United States and China's economic measures. The Japanese economy is expected to move toward a recovery as the trend toward setting wage increases is continuing, although consumer spending is slowing due to higher food prices.

In the drugstore industry, the size of the market has continued to increase as stores have continued to be opened while meeting needs in the dispensing and food categories. Efforts to improve productivity and control expenses strongly influence variations in profitability among companies.

Under these circumstances, we will work on improving profitability for the time being, while enhancing our store strategy, dispensing strategy, PB strategy, and DX strategy as outlined in the previous Medium-Term Management Plan. Based on the above, our consolidated financial results forecasts for the fiscal year ending February 28, 2026 are net sales of \(\frac{1}{4}\),113,400 million, operating income of \(\frac{1}{4}\)51,100 million, ordinary income of \(\frac{1}{4}\)50,300 million, and net income attributable to owners of the parent of \(\frac{1}{4}\)24,800 million.

(5) Basic Policy for Profit Distribution, and Dividends in the Current and Next Fiscal Years

The Group's basic policy is focused on shareholder returns through the payment of stable dividends while taking into account the need for funds to reinforce the operating base and support future business development. The Group plans to use the dividend payout ratio as a benchmark for the distribution of profits to shareholders.

In accordance with this policy, the Group pays an interim dividend and a year-end dividend.

For the second quarter of the current fiscal year, the Group paid an interim dividend of \(\frac{\pmathbf{1}}{15}\) per share as planned. At the end of the fiscal year, the Group has decided to pay a year-end dividend of \(\frac{\pmathbf{1}}{12}\) per share as initially planned based on the business results. As a result, the full-year dividend is \(\frac{\pmathbf{2}}{267}\) per share. For the fiscal year ending February 28, 2026, the Group plans to pay a full-year dividend of \(\frac{\pmathbf{2}}{267}\) per share as well.

For the fiscal year ending February 28, 2026, the Group will continue to pay an interim dividend and a year-end dividend for shareholders registered on the record dates of the second quarter-end and the fiscal year-end.

The Group intends to use retained earnings for investments to boost future corporate value, such as capital investment to open new stores and expand and refurbish existing stores, and to fund M&A deals and other initiatives that support growth.

2. Basic Approach to the Selection of Accounting Standards

The Group applies Japanese accounting standards. We will take appropriate measures regarding the adoption of International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS), considering the circumstances in Japan and overseas.
