Note 2: Existing store sales data is based on stores that have been continuously operating for at least 12 months as of the end of the month; data from stores that closed or temporarily suspended business during the month are not included.

Note 3: JINS also generates revenue from wholesale, e-commerce, and other operations. Sales growth may thus differ from that reported on the income statement.

■ Topics

In February, sales across all of the company's eyewear stores in Japan increased +9.4% YoY, and sales at existing stores rose +6.7%.

While customer traffic was affected by snowfall and other weather conditions during the month, existing store sales increased due to higher spend per customer, driven by ongoing promotional campaigns and initiatives to enhance customer service.

As of the end of February, the total number of eyewear stores in Japan was 560, representing a net increase of 2 stores.
